Villages Housing pick up North West award

Villages Housing Association Safer communities initiative, Stockbridge Village

The Stockbridge safer community initiative was developed when the association realised that, to have a real impact in the area, they needed to work in collaboration with other organisations.

The partnership between Knowsley Council, Merseyside police, Villages Housing and the local community has resulted in the area becoming a safer place to live and work and a more confident community in just one year. The partnership worked together to target criminal activity and support community engagement and development.

This included an additional resource of 12 Police Community Support Officers, each given a micro-beat of streets within the area enabling them to know the residents and build up trust with them. This led to increased intelligence regarding crime and anti-social behaviour activities in and around the estate.

This targeted approach has successfully resulted in a number of criminals being convicted. Equally important community confidence has increased with residents taking a more active role in the delivery of future services and ambitions for the area.

Vernon Jackson, Chief Executive of Villages said:

'Joint training and working has delivered amazing results – overall crime has reduced by 20% in 12 months and community engagement and intelligence has increased significantly.'

The Villages Safer Communities Initiative also took the Best impact on residents and Best partnership working awards on the day.

Incommunities Your Sporting Chance

Your Sporting Chance is a groundbreaking initiative that positively contributes to community cohesion, reduces anti-social behaviour and aims to reverse negative stereotypical views of young people today. It works with professional sporting organisations and uses the brand and players to encourage engagement.

The initiative offers young adults at risk of social, education or employment exclusion the opportunity to gain valuable life skills from work experience, education opportunities and team work. Already over 50 young people have benefited from the project which works with three sporting partners - Keighley Cougars RLFC, Bradford Bulls RLFC and Bradford City F.C.

Funding from Incommunities Foundation - the housing group's charitable arm - supports the work of three youth workers who provide a key link between the sporting partners and the young people.

Geraldine Howley, Incommunities Group Chief Executive said: 'We are thrilled that the project has achieved a double success in these prestigious awards.

'Your Sporting Chance combines the power of sport as an influential role model and effective youth project work. This successful team work is making a positive difference to the lives of the young people involved.'

The project also won the Best partnership working award.

North East Three Rivers win three times

Three Rivers - Pelaw View Community Group

Residents of the Sherburn Road Estate in Durham, owned by Three Rivers Housing Association, set up a community group to tackle antisocial behaviour.

The 'Pelaw View Community Group' has been incredibly successful, with its work resulting in a drop in crime and anti-social behaviour over two years. It has expanded, forming a management committee and has become a registered charity.

It now manages and delivers community projects, a café, youth forum and young people's activities. The group has shaped the service of the local community centre through consultation and voluntary work, recently undertaking projects with the local police, charities, NHS and Darlington FC.

Three Rivers also won the Best impact on residents award and Outstanding individual for Mandy Reay from the project. Mandy has worked tirelessly at the centre along with Three Rivers staff supporting the local community and as a team they have improved the lives of many people.
